

### SHARING JESUS WITH WOMEN

More than 40 years ago in Haiti, my heart was stubbornly determined to share Jesus with the Haitian women via a weekly Bible study. I felt intimidated, insecure, and initially insulted. But, I did my best to share Jesus because I felt if I didn't—who would? Those early days of social disorder and illiteracy were a challenge. We had no child care, and they had no watches to even show up on time. On one occasion, I was brought a starving baby in a bath towel. I held the baby as I taught, and after class I went with the mother to find a wet nurse. The baby (Jezila) survived and I actually saw her on my last trip to Haiti.

Eventually, I invited other women to start Bible studies in their respective churches. With help from dedicated missionaries, Bible studies began in all of our villages—52 Bible studies in total.

When we went to the Dominican Republic in 2000, I also felt the urgency to share the Gospel. I found a few international English-speaking women who wanted fellowship and we met at a sidewalk café. Some were believers and others were there for friendship. It's not for us to determine results, but to keep planting, witnessing, and sharing Jesus. Now, Haitian women and Dominican women are leading in these ministries.

### **BIBLE CLASSES AT SCHOOL**

Bible classes at school can profoundly impact students' lives, fostering spiritual and personal growth that influences their daily routines. Ysaías Castaños, who teaches the high school Bible classes at Colegio Nueva Vida and also helps lead chapel services, has observed how exposure to Scripture can quietly but powerfully shape young minds and hearts over time.

Last year's distribution of Bibles was a significant moment for many students, going beyond merely receiving just any book. It sparked a change within their hearts. Professor Ysaías has noticed students prioritizing their Bible reading over other activities. His own sons, Ysaías and Benjamín Castaños Polanco, both students at Colegio Nueva Vida, have witnessed their father's faith in action and have experienced their own spiritual growth as a result. Some students have even confided in Professor Ysaías about their newfound dedication to attending church, which is a testament to the lasting impact of studying God's Word. And beyond individual transformations, there is a noticeable shift in how students interact with their teachers and each other—displaying Christian values within our school community. ~Heather Williams Katz

# TRADE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Our L'Acul pastor, Richemond Casseus, has a trade school on their campus. He is utilizing the same space as his church and elementary school—just at different times. He says when he was out in the community, he'd see many young people just loitering. Their parents couldn't afford to keep them in school or send them for other training. Sometimes it was due to an early pregnancy or delinquency. He decided to provide training right in the neighborhood that was accessible to them. He offers sewing, electric, and plumbing classes as well as generator, motorcycle, and phone repair.

The sewing program has 28 students and runs for 15 months. Bidgie Dupleant, a former student of New Missions, attends the sewing classes. She hopes to one day support herself and help her family. Bidgie will be in the first group to graduate. Pastor Casseus states there are already a few phone repair graduates earning some income.

Pastor Guillaume in Leogane also has a trade school. His vision is to help the youth in his church find employment. His program includes plumbing, tiling, music, and cosmetology training. ~Rachel DeTellis

# JESUS IS THE GREAT PHYSICIAN

TO GIVE US A NEW

SELF-IMAGE.

There's an old story about a family on vacation traveling through the Great Smoky Mountains in Tennessee. One morning, they stopped at a country restaurant for breakfast. The restaurant was filled with tourists on a hot July day when an old man approached the table and asked the folks where they were from and, without asking, pulled up a chair and sat down at the table to join them. He pointed out the window at

the mountains in front of them. He said, "You see that mountain? Not far from the base of that mountain there was a boy born to an unwed mother. That boy had a hard time growing up because he never knew his father. Everywhere that

mirror, she couldn't see any change. She broke into tears and cried, "Oh, I knew it wouldn't work."

The story you tell yourself is the one you believe. That story is your self-image; the beliefs you have about who you are and what you can do. You can rewrite your story once you begin a relationship with Jesus Christ. I have a new self-image in Christ. The Bible says: I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me; No weapon formed against me shall prosper; Who can separate me from the love of Christ?; Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Jesus has come to give us a new self-image; a self-image based on His love for you, all that He has done for you, and all that He is going to do for you in the future.
