Haïti

Dear Friends of New England and World Missions:

Last November, I was part of a 25-member team that visited the nation of Haiti under the leadership of Rev. George and Jeanne DeTellis of New England and World Missions (NEWM).

While there, some of us visited a small, almost-forgotten island called Zetoit. After presenting its inhabitants with a variety of goods and supplies, we listened intently to the words of the island's pastor as he was interpreted:

"Over here," he said, "we don't have anything to give you, but we will be praying for you. We thank the Lord for a great love, because he put that kind of love in the American peoples' hearts that can feel exactly the need of the Haitian people on this island. We never had a school years ago. By the grace of God, by the help of the American people, some of the children can come to school now. Thank you for the clothes, for everything you bring for us today -- for the food, we so happy about -- our teacher get paid, we so happy about -- some of the people help us to get house over here, we so happy about. We bless the Name of the Lord for a great love. We don't have a good bed over here, but never discouraged, but never discouraged. And, I will continue to pray for you, me and my church, and God can continue to bless you and bless your family, your home. Never discouraged, and I hope I will see you (again) one day. May the Lord bless you!"

That was just one experience gained through that unforgettable and emotional trip to Haiti. There were many others.

Our team consisted of men and women of all ages and from many walks of life, most of them from Worcester and Worcester County, and included nine Haitian people from the Boston area.

We experienced love, hospitality and great faith emanating from the Haitian Christians. I lefttheir country wondering just how well I really knew God, and with a desire and commitment to ease some of the poverty and sickness there.

NEWM, based in Worcester, Massachusetts, has felt the tug of the Holy Spirit to minister in Haiti. They plan to purchase five acres of oceanfront land in a village called Leogane, located near Port-au-Prince, the nation's capital city. They want to drive a well on the property, build a church and clinic, and establish housing. They hope to purchase a boat to carry supplies to and from the village, and to bring much-needed materials, food, and medical help to out-of-the-way places and islands.

Pastor George and his wife, Jeanne, will offer housing on the mission in Loegane for interested Christians who may want to spend time at the mission station during a combination vacation/ministry visit. The housing would also be available to those who are called there for more extensive missionary service.

You could call their concept an interdenominational Christian Peace Corp.

All of these purposed plans will be costly, and I realize that some of you reading this letter are already committed to many worthwhile projects. You may feel that, at this time, you cannot be involved in another on any long-term commitment basis.

That is why I believe the Lord has shown me that a \$100-a-plate dinner will be an effective way to sponsor the ministry of NEWM to the Haitian people. There will be no offering taken at the dinner, and there will be no pledge cards to be signed. You will receive the very best meal that can be provided by the restaurant where the dinner will be held. You will hear interesting guest speakers and view slides of the people and country of Haiti.

I, originally, had no desire to go to Haiti, but was asked to pray about it. I did, and the Lord clearly directed me to go! I will never regret being obedient to His voice.

Please pray and ask the Lord if you should attend this dinner. If the answer is "yes," then come join us for a joyful time in Him at the HAITI LOVE BANQUET, schedule for Friday evening, April 30, 1982, at 7:00 p.m. at the Sheraton-Lincoln Inn, 500 Lincoln St., Worcester, Massachusetts.

Dear Christian Friends,

It has now been several weeks since we returned from Haiti. The experience of the trip has had time to settle in our minds and for us to have much time for prayer and reflection. Twenty-five of us went to Haiti, and our lives will never be the same.

Haiti is one of the neediest countries in the world. There are spiritual needs. Much of the country is still under the crippling influence of Voodoo. There are material needs. Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the world. It would break your heart to see children with bloated bellies and bleached-out hair and wonder what influence the malnutrition is having on their minds. There are physical needs - needs for wells for fresh water nets to fish with and seeds to plant. Needs - tremendous needs.

Haiti has won our hearts. We love the country and the people. We are now about to become even more directly involved with this country. The Lord is leading us to purchase 5 acres of land in Leogane where we will start a mission station. Here, there will be a church, school, and clinic, and from this base we hope to preach the message of God's redemption through Jesus Christ in this entire area.

For this, we need the help of our brothers and sisters in Christ. The land will cost us \$7,600 and lawyer's fees \$500. Much more will be needed to put in a well, erect a building and equip the station.

This is a glorious time to live for the Lord and to give ourselves to His service. I hope you will become involved in this ministry!

Dear Friends,

We would like to keep you posted on our progress in establishing a mission station in Haiti.

We have set a date on our departure. On Tuesday, January the 4th, we will leave to begin this work. Along with the 5 full-time missionaries, about 10 other people will be going to help put up buildings and work with the people.

The missionary team is meeting on a weekly basis to learn the Creole language. A constitution for the mission has been written and will be submitted to the government of Haiti for us to be officially recognized. We have begun to gather supplies - cooking pots, beds, blankets, tools, etc.

Much, much prayer has gone up - the burden is great. "Our hope is in God." We have learned that we must ever keep the vision of the Lord before us. What we see in faith God will bring to pass.

Presently 8 children have been adopted. This is a sponsorship for a daily feeding program and an educational program.

We have been in touch with some of the Haitian Pastors - they are also waiting for our arrival.

Please be in prayer for us. We are still working to raise the support of our missionaries.
